"It's a horrible situation when the only member of your family finds out they are terminally ill. Fast forward a few months and if you are extremely lucky your loved one will be in St Andrew's Hospice, Airdrie.

Every member of staff is so caring, kind and supportive.

Nothing is too much trouble.

The best part of all is the massages; a bit of TLC when you need it most. So happy to see the stresses and strains be replaced with a smile."

"My sister and I are nurses and had to advocate/nurse my dad through much of his illness, providing hands-on care including some personal care at times. The hospice staff allowed us to truly for the first time step back and just be with him.

They provided us with the biggest room they could, with space to stay the night if we wished.

After his passing, I remember sitting on the floor feeling utterly lost and a lady from the hospice just taking the time to sit beside me. Even after his passing they treated him with such dignity."

Stephen's Journey

"Hiya, my name's Stephen and I'm here to talk about my journey with St Andrew's Hospice..."

"My partner Claire had been fighting tumours behind her eye since she was 10 years old. She was

always able to beat them. But then they moved to her brain. We got to the stage where Claire had to go into the Hospice.

"Claire was in the Hospice for 12 weeks and I can honestly say that in that 12 weeks, she didn't want to come out because the care and attention she got there was unbelievable – from the doctors, the nurses, receptionists, volunteers... she loved talking to them all. Sister Catherine came around every day to talk to Claire. And there's no time limit [on visiting]. When I used to go up there, I could stay as long as I wanted to. They've even got facilities that if people want to, they can stay overnight with their loved one.

"After 12 weeks, Claire came home but I still took



her to the Hospice's Outpatient activities. Sadly, Claire passed on 25th June but I cannot emphasise the care, attention and love that she received from the doctors, the nurses and everyone at St Andrew's Hospice.

"I now go to the Hospice's Carers' Café on a Monday from 12noon – 2pm. The people there have gone through the same situation as me so they understand. We sit as a group with Elaine, the Outpatient & Community Manager, and the rest of the team who talk to us and help us. It's a great group, I've been going since July. I don't like missing it. If I miss it, I feel like I'm missing out on something as I've made a lot of friends there.

"At the Carers' Café, I can get Reiki if I need it. I've also been offered counselling to deal with grief. So even although Claire isn't in the Hospice anymore, I can still continue to go.

"Whilst I was in the Carers' Café, someone told me about the Hospice's new Shopping Outlet so I thought I'd find out more. You have to see it to believe it! It's a 22,000 square ft. unit – it's one of the biggest projects the Hospice has undertaken.

"I helped the joiners in the lead up to the

opening of the Outlet and since it launched in November, I've been there every day because for me, it's great. It's my saviour. If it wasn't for volunteering in the Outlet, I'd be in the house and to be honest with you, I'd have too much thinking time. I also feel like I'm giving something back, because Claire loved the Hospice, she loved everything about it.

"I'm part of a team down there, there's great community spirit. There's good social engagement too, we're planning a team night out. But we need more volunteers as it's a big outlet to run.

"It doesn't matter if you can spare two, three or four hours per week – even if it's just a couple of hours, there's lots you can do. You can check in and separate out the donations; from clothing to bric-a-brac. You can help build furniture, you can drive to collect and deliver furniture. I am now registered to drive for the Hospice and I'm going to do my first furniture delivery this weekend.

"We rely on volunteers so it would be great if you could come and join us and be part of our team. It's a great place. You really feel like you're giving back to your community and the Hospice."

Mildred's Story

"My husband, Harvie, was diagnosed with a life-limiting illness a few years ago. Our daughter Karen saw on the Hospice's Facebook page that their Outpatient Department ran activities so we made contact with the Hospice. Initially, Harvie attended the Strength and Balance class but he found this was too much for him.

Upon chatting to Elaine, she suggested that he come along to Wellness Together as he loves music and he now gets a lot out of attending this group.

I have been attending the Carers' Café on a Monday since December and I get so much benefit from it, especially the complementary therapies which I find very relaxing. It is so helpful to meet with other carers who are in a similar position to myself.

We both feel so supported by the Outpatient Team at St Andrew's."

My name is Elaine Gray, I am the Outpatient and Community Team Manager here at St Andrew's Hospice.

I have worked in healthcare for over 25 years. I have had the honour and privilege of working at the Hospice for the last two years and feel completely inspired by our patients every day. To work in a Hospice setting, one of the most important skills is listening to our patients and their families and ensuring they are supported physically, socially and emotionally.

My team's job is to support and enhance our patients' physical health and emotional wellbeing, helping them to set personal goals, all with the aim of improving their quality of life and supporting them to live with their condition.

Our Outpatient services include a Wellbeing Programme, a Wellness Together group, Music Therapy, Complementary Therapies, Fatigue Management, Strength & Balance and Adapted Tai Chi classes as well as our Carers' Café for patients' loved ones.

The benefit of these services to our patients and their families can be transformational. As well as learning ways to manage their condition, friendships are made and a support network is built. Everyone enjoys each other's company over some food, games, music and even dancing!

I see such a difference from when patients and carers arrive into the department to when they leave. Their mood has improved and they feel less isolated and lonely.

You may have seen in the press recently that hospices across Scotland are seeing their funding being depleted. St Andrew's Hospice continues to face financial challenges. I wish I could say that we could get by without asking you for help but that, sadly, is not the reality.

What does your role involve?

I find my role fulfilling as I enjoy chatting to customers in the Cafe and understand the importance of my role in ensuring the patients in the hospice have a positive experience.

Working as part of a team to ensure the care and support for patients and their families. I take pride in the organisation and running of the kitchen, cafe and other domestic areas. Despite the demanding aspects, overall my job brings a great deal of satisfaction and enjoyment.

Do you have a particular memory or story from your time at the hospice you'd like to share?

My aunt was diagnosed with cancer and her health declined rather quickly. This resulted in her being transferred from the hospital to St. Andrew's Hospice. Shortly after this my uncle (her brother) was

also diagnosed with cancer and placed in St. Andrew's Hospice. This allowed us, as a family, to spend time together, going between the wards. However, the realisation of them not spending their final days together as siblings was disheartening. The staff also came to this realisation and were so helpful in arranging for them to spend some quality time together. Both beds were brought into the conservatory, allowing them to spend an afternoon together. This created a beautiful moment of sibling bonding as they reminisced over old times. Our family deeply appreciated this kind gesture from the hospice staff.

What does St Andrews hospice mean to you?

St Andrew's Hospice to me is a place which provides comfort to not only patients, but their families too. Patients receive high quality, personalised care during their time here. The care provided is not only medical, but also covers spiritual aspects. I find this inspiring and truly believe St Andrew's Hospice is having a positive impact on the community.
